"SECRET" OF CLERGY ANNUAL STUDY WEEK REVEALED

Some parishioners asked me what we clergy "studied" during the recent May10-14 Clergy Study Week. It is not really a secret and you have the right to know what your clergy have learned. Thanks for the \$120 per day room, board & speaker expenses from the parish at the San Juan Bautista Franciscan Retreat House. The study week is meant to complement our spiritual retreat week on October.

This year's theme is on Social Justice and Concerns in our ministry entitled "Restoring God's Holy Order." The study week focused on "the ministries of the deacon, priest and bishop as vocal teachers, preachers, and advocates for justice, seeking to restore the world order to its intended holy purpose." One week prior to it we even had "A Poverty Simulation" jumpstart process at Our Lady of Peace Ed. Center to provide us with an understanding of the day-to-day stresses of living without sufficient financial/personal resources. The Bishop indicated his highest priority by participating fully in both events and serving as "commentator." Also any absence had to be explained to him in writing beforehand.

From Monday afternoon to Tuesday evening we had 6 sessions (1 hr. 15 min. average each) given by a *dynamic keynote speaker* **JACK JEZ-REEL**, Founder and Executive Director of JustFAITH Ministries: (1)*The Implications of Catholic Social Teaching*; (2) *The Faith Jesus Inherits: A Covenant of Justice*; (3) *The Ministry of Jesus - A Context of Broken Hearts and Bodies*; (4) *The Ministry of Jesus: A Vision of a Great Love that Transforms All*; (5) *Continuing the Work of Jesus: Strategies for Transforming Hearts and Society*; (6) *Continuing the Work of Jesus: Practical Steps for Your Congregation*. Discussions followed most sessions with optional movies in the evening to "conscientize" us ("They Killed Sister Dorothy," etc..). Sessions 7 & 8 were the Bishops Annual Address and the Council of Priests' Business. Wednesday Session 9: *Growing A Parish Social Concerns Ministry* by **Jane Ferguson**, Cath. Char. CYO, Archdiocese of S.F.; Session 10: *The Community Organizing Model* by **Matt Hammer**, Executive Director PACT San Jose. Afternoon was free time with Mass, Social Hour, BBQ & Entertainment. Thursday's Session 11: *Poverty is Global* by Deacon **Joe Symkowicz**, Partnership & Advocacy Officer, Sacramento; Session 12: *Human Trafficking: Growing Epidemic* by **Sr. Caritas Foster, SHF** (Anti-Trafficking Coordinator) & **Lt. John Vanek** (Manager Human Trafficking Task Force, San Jose Police Dept.); Session 13: *Catholic Identity and Environmental Stewardship* by **Bro. Keith D. Warner, OFM** of the Dept. of Rel. Studies Center for Science, Tech. & Society, SCU; Session 14 : *Restoring Hope, Restoring Justice* by **Suzanne Neuhaus**, Victims Services, California Dept. of Corrections; Session 15 : *The Death Penalty and a Civilized Society: Can We Have Both* by **Mike Farrell**, Actor & Activist Pres. Death Penalty Focus. Evening Sessions: Annual Financial Report, Council and Committee Elections etc.. Friday Morning sessions: Session 16: *Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County: Resources for Social Ministries* by **Gregory Kepferle** - CEO, **Liz Lilly** -Dir. Community and Parish Partnership, **Ruben Solorio**, Community Relations Manager; *Step Up Silicon Valley: Campaign to Cut Poverty* by **Terrie Iacino**, Director Step Up Silicon Valley. Finally..Session 17: *Parish Resources and Support: Diocesan Office for Social Ministries* by **Linda Batton**, Director Office of Social Ministries/Parish Services, Diocese of San Jose. Wow....that was quite a lot to digest.. a mouthful to learn. It will take us many months to ruminate on these food for our souls and ministries. Now you know the "secret" why we had to be there and why we looked exhausted coming back to the Parish. But it was very good for us and worth our sacrifice.

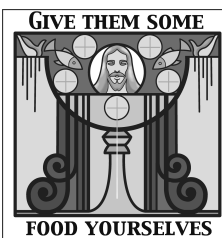

SECRETOS REVELADOS DE LA SEMANA ANUAL DE ESTUDIO PARA LOS CLERIGOS

Algunos parroquianos me han preguntado que estudiamos nosotros "clérigos" durante la reciente semana del 10 al 14 de Mayo en la semana de estudio de Clérigos. En realidad no es un secreto y ustedes tienen el derecho de saber lo que sus Clérigos aprendieron. Gracias por los \$120 para los gastos de el cuarto, comida y exponentes en el centro Franciscano de retiro de San Juan Bautista. La semana de estudios esta diseñada para complementar la semana de nuestro retiro espiritual en Octubre.

Este año el tema fue sobre La Justicia Social y concierne en nuestro ministro titulado "Restaurando Las Ordenes Sagradas de Dios." La semana de estudio se enfoco en "Los ministerios del Diaconado, sacerdocio y obispado como maestros que llevan la voz, predicadores y defensores de la justicia, buscando restaurar las ordenes en el mundo y las intenciones del propósito divino." Una semana antes tuvimos "Un Simulacro de Pobreza" como comienzo al proceso en el Centro de Educación de la parroquia de Nuestra Señora de la Paz para proveernos con un entendimiento de la tensión diaria de la vida sin suficientes recursos financieros y personales. El Obispo nos sugirió atender a la dos actividades y llevar el mensaje. Y si uno del clero no podría asistir, tendría que dar razón por escrito de antemano.

Desde el Lunes en la tarde a la noche del Martes tuvimos 6 sesiones (de mas o menos 1 hora con 15 minutos cada una) dada por un orador dinámico Jack Jezreet, fundador y director ejecutivo del ministerio de "Just Faith" (Fe Justa).

Para hacerles la historia corta, él hablo sobre la enseñanza social de la iglesia basada en el enfoque de Jesus hacia los pobres y los necesitados. El tambien propuso algunas estrategias practicas "de Fe Justa" y como poner en acción nuestro ministerios parroquiales. Tuvimos reflexiones después de cada sesión y algunas películas para "concientizarnos" durante la noche tal como la "Mataron a la Hermana Dorothy en El Amazona del Brasil", "El Regalo de Nuestro Planeta Tierra", "Traficando Con Gente Y vendiéndolos Por trabajos baratos y Prostitución" y "Mojado: un documental de indocumentado" una película documentaria acerca de la gente pobre de Honduras, Guatemala, el resto de Centro América y México viajando ilegalmente a los Estados Unidos y siendo victimas de los sindicatos y pandillas violentas en México. Etc. La tarde del Miércoles la tuvimos libre con una hora social, carne azada y entretenimiento por talentosos sacerdotes y diáconos. Las otras once sesiones hasta el viernes incluyeron importante información sobre los problemas de la pobreza en varios países del mundo y el creciente problema del tráfico de gente y venta de ellos en casas de prostitución y a lugares de baja paga aquí en los Estados Unidos. Otro tópico discutido fue la de la razón por que las iglesias Cristianas no están a favor de la Pena Capital y las últimas sesiones fueron sobre la ayuda que nosotros podemos obtener de las Oficinas de Caridades Católicas y el Ministerio Social Diocesano para ayudar a los pobres de las parroquias. !Wow! !17 sesiones sin siesta en la tarde, esto fue como regresar al riguroso trabajo de la escuela otra vez!. Con razón algunos de nuestros sacerdotes viejos y diáconos (incluyéndome a mi y al diacono Leonel) no pudimos evitar caer de cansancio y talvez roncar en algunas partes de las sesiones. Ahora ustedes saben el "secreto" por que nosotros teníamos que estar allí y por que nos mirábamos bien cansados cuando regresamos a la parroquia. Pero estuvo muy bueno para nosotros y valió la pena el sacrificio.
