Thank you all for your goodbyes, fare well wishes and prayers at our parish reception on Friday night. After 33 years of service the Holy Ghost Fathers have informed Bishop McGrath that they can no longer provide priests to staff the parish. Fr. John Fitzpatrick and myself have been transferred to St. Dunstan's Church in Millbrae. Our address as from July 1st will be

Holy Ghost Fathers (or Spiritans) are about 3,000 strong world wide. We were founded in 1703 by Claude Poullart de Places, and re-founded in 1848 by Fr. Libermann (a Jewish convert) principally for missions in Africa. The Irish branch was founded 150 years ago in 1859. Fr. Fitzpatrick worked for 30 years in Brazil. I worked for 15 years in Kenya. When we were going through the seminary in Ireland – there were over 250 seminarians studying for priesthood. Today there are none. Our seminary is closed. The Congregation world wide has nearly 1,000 students. Most of these are African. The African church is now sending missionaries to Ireland and the U.S! Our head office in the U.S. is Duquesne University in Pittsburgh.

The Holy Spirit urges us to discern the signs of the times. For some years now the focus has been on non-ordained lay missionaries. God's Spirit is still calling us all to ministry and mission – not necessarily as ordained ministers. The day when parishes will be administered by non-ordained personnel is at hand. We can never step into the same stream twice.

Thank you all for your friendship and support. May it you bring bountiful blessings.

The Cry of the Earth

From Fr. Dermot Lane's sermon at the World Day of Peace in Clarendon St. Church, Dublin on Jan. 1st, 2009

The Call to care for the earth can only be met by recovering the bond that exists between the human and natural world, by rediscovering the underlying unity that obtains between the story of humanity and the story of the cosmos. Unless we can recover the kinship, that is the deep relationship that exists between the human community and the earth community, we will in truth end up destroying not only the earth, but also the human community.

It is worth remembering that for the greater part of the history of humanity there was a relationship of respect and reverence between humanity and the cosmos. It is only since the time of the Enlightenment, over the last 200 years or so, that the universe has become 'a disenchanting place'. Nature became mechanized with the rise of modernity. Modern science turned nature into an object of exploitation and manipulation for the exclusive gain of humanity-at the expense of the inherent value, beauty and integrity of the natural world as a part of God's creation.

What is even more fascinating, however, is that modern science itself has begun to correct the wrong turn it took. Since the middle of the 20th century, science has rediscovered the deep bond, the intimate relationship and fundamental unity that exists between the human and the natural world. This has happened through the discovery of the 'big bang' theory about the origins of the universe, a story that brings us back some 15 billion years in time.

In the light of this new cosmic story, we are beginning to see 'a re-enchantment of the universe' and to sense something of the beauty, the integrity and the order of our universe. For example, we now know that we live in a finely-tuned universe that has been evolving over the last 15 billion years, that everything and everybody in that universe is inter-related, inter-connected and inter-dependent.

There can be no doubt that the development of a balanced relationship between humanity and the environment has moved to the centre of political agenda in a relatively short space of time. The point being made by Pope Benedict in his message for the World Day of Peace is that this debate must be informed by values, spiritual and ethical values, and not just purely pragmatic considerations. Furthermore, this debate should not be left to unregulated market forces. Instead, the debate must be guided by moral norms.

There is a challenge here for all Christians, for all of the Christian churches working together, to become an environmental lobby, to hear the cry of the earth to be the voice of the earth, both at local and international levels in the years ahead.

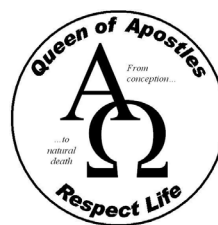

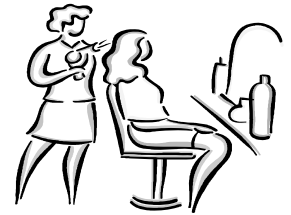
