Last Sunday, August 9th, St. Lawrence The Martyr Parish of Santa Clara, celebrated their Golden Jubilee. Way back in May, our own St. Athanasius Church also celebrated our Golden Jubilee. Also in that same month our neighbor, St. William Catholic Church of Los Altos celebrated its Golden Jubilee. Unnoticed by many, another neighbor church (formerly an independent parish) also celebrated its Golden Jubilee, The Our Lady of the Rosary, part of St. Thomas Aquinas Parish in Palo Alto. Eight years ago in 2001, when I was Pastor of St. Joseph of Mountain View, we celebrated its Centennial Jubilee (100 years as a Parish).

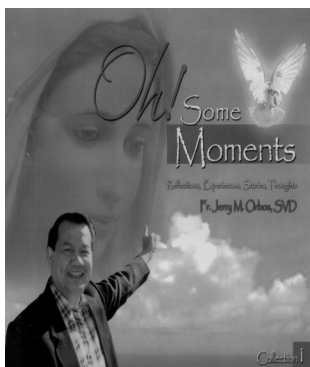

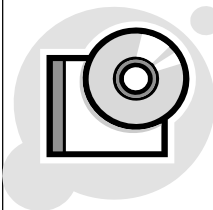

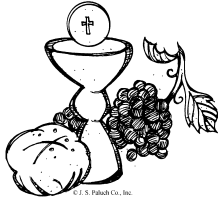
